VACANCIES: One full-time position and one relief position in the Rockland County Department of Mental Health.

POSITIONS EXIST IN: The Rockland County Department of Mental Health.

RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS: All residence requirements for this examination have been waived.

SALARY: The starting salary for an individual without board certification in psychiatry is \$132,817 annually for a 40-hour-work-week with the County of Rockland. The starting salary for an individual with board certification in psychiatry is \$137,817 annually for a 40-hour-work-week with the County of Rockland. Salary will be pro-rated for less-than-full-time positions.

WHAT THE JOB IS LIKE: This is professional psychiatric work permitting some latitude for independent judgment. The Psychiatrist I may assist and supplement the work of an administrative psychiatrist in psychiatric services, primarily in team therapy or may also have supervisory responsibilities over a team of workers. The work is performed under the direction of a higher-level psychiatrist or administrator. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: By the last date for filing, you must have: Possession of a license to practice medicine in New York State and either certification in Psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology or proof of eligibility* for certification.

*Evidence of licensure by the New York State Education Department to practice medicine and completion of three years of approved resident training in Psychiatry together with the candidate's written statement that he/she has applied to take the current or proximate certifying examination will be acceptable proof of eligibility for Board certification. (Copies of current license, board certification, proof of resident training and all supporting statements should be submitted with the application.)

SUBJECT OF EXAMINATION: There will be no written or oral test for this examination. Candidates meeting the minimum qualifications will receive a rating based on an evaluation of their training and experience against the background of the duties of the position. You are, therefore, asked to include in your application a summary of all pertinent training and experience in sufficient detail so that your experience may be evaluated against the duties of the position. Your application will be rated on the following items. Please be sure the application and any supporting documents are sufficiently complete to avail yourself of as high a score as possible.

1. Do you meet the minimum qualifications? (See above.)
2. Do you have any specialized post-psychiatric residency training in Psychiatry?
3. Do you possess board certification in Psychiatry? (Copies of current license and board certification should be submitted with the application.)
4. Do you have any continuing education in the field of Psychiatry?
5. What experience do you have beyond the minimum requirement for this position that was in Community Mental Health or Institutional Psychiatry? (Note starting month and year and ending month and year as well as hours per week worked.)
6. What experience, if any, have you had in private practice? (Note starting month and year and ending month and year as well as hours per week worked.)

NOTE: A resume does not substitute for the completed application but may supplement the application. Month and year as well as hours per week of employment must be indicated. **Also include a copy of your professional license or documentation indicating eligibility for licensure.**

Candidates who submit incomplete applications or documentation may be disqualified. Additional information will not be accepted after applications have been evaluated.
