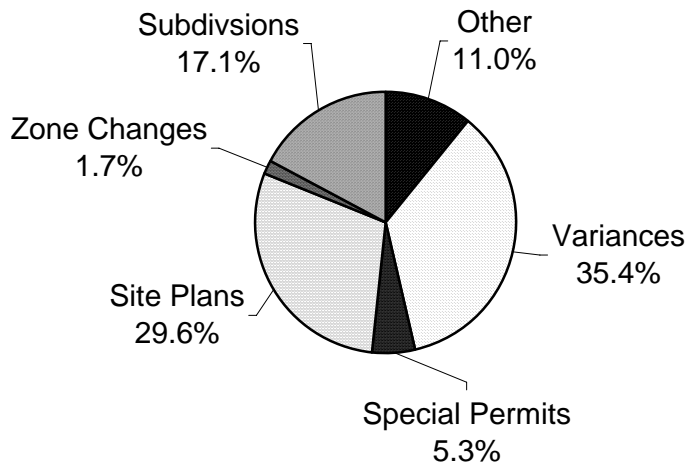


## Pie Chart for Categories

The pie chart in Figure #5 below illustrates the breakdown of the applications by categories. The major categories include subdivisions, site plans, variances, zone changes, special permits and other. Variance applications comprised 35.4% of the development applications reviewed by the County Planning Department, followed by site plans that comprised 29.6% of the reviews. Subdivisions were the next highest category with 17.1% of the total. The “other” category, which includes zoning code amendments, performance standard review, building permits, interpretations and official map changes, comprised 11% of the total number of reviews. The zone changes and special permits combined, equaled seven percent of the applications reviewed. The year 2007 saw a major change from the past in the breakdown of the type of applications. In the past, site plans were consistently the highest percentage of the type of applications reviewed. However, in 2007, variances outnumbered all other types of applications for a record high of 35.4%.
